Introduction

The MSA Officials' Yearbook (the Red Book) continues as a companion to the MSA Competitors' Yearbook (the Blue Book).

While the Blue Book continues to detail all the Rules and Regulations relating to Motor Sport Competitions, this book carries those sections that are applicable to Officials only. These two books will simplify the Competitors' volume and combine all of the Club and Officials information into the complementary Red Book.

The Criteria for Clerks of the Course licensing, Technical Officials and Timekeepers, are all printed at the start of the respective listings for those particular officials. In addition, all the Technical Officials (Environment Scrutineers, Eligibility Scrutineers, Car and Kart Scrutineers and Technical Commissioners), are listed under the one heading of Technical Officials. The Judicial Advisory notes previously published in

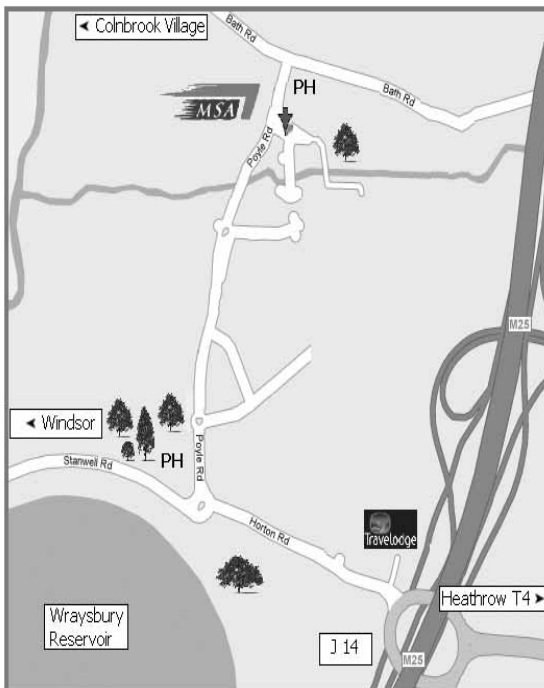
the Blue Book as Section U continue to be incorporated into this book.

A précis of those notes as they affect competitors is added to Section O of the Blue Book as an appendix.

All Officials are reminded of their duties and responsibilities as detailed in Section C of the MSA Competitors' Yearbook.

It is expected that as representatives of the MSA, licensed officials in particular will be suitably dressed for their role and be readily identifiable as an MSA Licensed Official. The MSA Official badge is a means of identification and should be worn at all times when acting in the capacity of a licensed official.

Remember that smart, functional and appropriate clothing will add significantly to the status and identity of licensed officials when dealing with competitors or the general public.
