Formed in 1958, the ***East Midlands Association of Motor Clubs Ltd*** is one of thirteen Regional Associations created by the national governing body for four-wheel motor sport (now known as **Motorsport UK**) for the purpose of co-ordinating motor sport affairs in their respective areas and to act as a link between **Motorsport UK** and **Motor Clubs**.

This Association is represented on **Motorsport UK's** Regional Committee by a delegate. The Regional Committee is responsible for discussing all matters which are likely to affect clubs in all branches of motor sport and advising **Motorsport UK** of any changes of Regulations etc. which they feel may be of benefit to clubs. The Regional Committee also liaises with other specialist committees and has direct representation on both rallies and safety committees.

The Association promotes various championships each year and has at its disposal a host of knowledgeable people who will be only too happy to provide help and information on anything connected to Motorsport activities.

In summary the Association is there to help member clubs with any problems they may have.

CONSTITUTION and GENERAL RULES

1 Title:

- 1.1 The name of the Association shall be the '**East Midlands Association of Motor Clubs Ltd**' hereafter referred to as the EMAMC

2 Objectives:

- 2.1 The objective of the EMAMC is to assist as a liaison between the Member Clubs, Motorsport UK, any adjacent Regional Associations, or any other relevant organisations, for mutual consultation in the furtherance of all Motor Sport activities.
- 2.2 Provide its Member Clubs with information, advice, assistance and access to training on matters connected with Motor Sport.
- 2.3 To encourage Motor Sport by the promotion of Championships and good public relations.
- 2.3.1 Work with the Sports Council and other Regional Associations in producing, maintaining and implementing Motor Sports development plans.

3 Membership:

- 3.1 Membership of the EMAMC is open to any Motor Club. Acceptance is at the discretion of the other member clubs, through the Executive Officers.
- 3.2 Applications to join the EMAMC should be made in writing to the EMAMC Secretary.
- 3.2.1 The EMAMC Secretary will respond by inviting the Motor Club to attend the next Delegates meeting, when reasons for membership can be presented to the Member Club delegates attending the meeting.

4 Officers:

- 4.1 The Executive Officers of the EMAMC who carry voting rights, are as follows:-
The Chairman (casting vote only), Vice Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Press Officer, Regional Training Officer and Awards Secretary who are elected annually at the EMAMC Annual General Meeting and additionally, the Life Vice-Presidents.
- 4.1.1 Also carrying voting rights are:
The Championship Registrars, who are to be elected at the October Delegates meeting for the following Championship year.
- 4.1.2 The other Members of the Executive Committee, who have no voting rights are:-
The Route Liaison Officers, the Forestry Liaison Officers and Radio Co-ordinators who operate within the EMAMC map areas being 119, 120, 128, 129, 140, 141 and 152.
- 4.1.3 These persons may attend and speak at all EMAMC Delegate and Executive meetings.
- 4.2 The Executive Officers shall have the power to co-opt any additional persons, as they deem necessary.

5 Meetings:

- 5.1** The EMAMC shall hold four (4) Delegates Meetings per year which will normally be on the second Tuesday of the following months: January, April, July, and October. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in April, and the Election of Championship Registrars shall be held in October.
- 5.2** Additional meetings may be convened if urgent business demands it, or if arranged by the EMAMC Executive. In cases of need (for example, in an emergency or to avoid clashes with other meetings), the Executive may reschedule the meetings required by 4.1.1 and 5.1.
 - 5.2.1** Twenty-one (21) days written notice must be given of such an Additional Meeting.
- 5.3** The EMAMC will hold its Annual General Meeting each year to receive the Reports of the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.
 - 5.3.1** The Executive Officers for the following year will also be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
 - 5.3.2** The EMAMC Secretary shall give all Member Club twenty-one (21) days written notice of the forthcoming Annual General Meeting, plus the Agenda and any proposals for inclusion at that meeting, which must have been submitted to the Secretary from Member Clubs at least twenty-eight (28) days prior to the Annual General Meeting.
- 5.4** A quorum shall be 20% of paid-up Member Clubs.
 - 5.4.1** Each Member Club may send up to four (4) Delegates per meeting, but are only entitled to one (1) vote per paid-up Member Club.
 - 5.4.2** No Delegate may represent more than one (1) Member Club unless written authority from either the Member Club, or the Member Club's delegate, is received by the Secretary prior to the start of the meeting.
- 5.5** All matters put to a vote shall be decided by the simple majority of the paid-up Member Clubs present at the meeting.
 - 5.5.1** The Chairperson shall have the casting vote.
 - 5.5.2** In the absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman will take the Chair at all Delegate / Executive meetings. If neither is present, then the EMAMC Secretary will chair the meeting.
- 5.6** An Extra-Ordinary General Meeting may be called by the Executive Officers, having given Member Clubs twenty-one (21) days written notice, or by written request to the EMAMC Secretary by five (5) Member Clubs.
- 5.7** If a proposal is put forward at a Delegates meeting, it must be by a paid-up Member Club delegate.
- 5.8** The Executive Officers may only put forward a recommendation to a Delegates meeting, apart from any alteration needed to the Rules governing the Championships it promotes.
 - 5.8.1** An invitation may be extended by the Executive Officers for the representations of a Body interested in Motor Sport to attend a meeting.

6 Subscriptions:

- 6.1 Subscriptions for each year shall be recommended by the EMAMC Executive during the current financial year, i.e. 1st January to 31st December and subject to approval by the Member Clubs, the increase will be effective from the following 1st January.
- 6.1.1 A minimum of twenty-one (21) days written notice of any proposed increase must be given to Member Clubs.
- 6.2 Any Member Club not renewing their subscription prior to the start of the Annual General Meeting will not be entitled to further voting rights until subscriptions are paid.
- 6.2.1 Clubs who have not paid their Annual Subscription prior to the start of the July delegates meeting may not propose their events for inclusion in the EMAMC Championships.
- 6.3 Any Motorsport UK recognised Motor Club joining during a year will pay a subscription for that year calculated in proportion to the number of whole months remaining in the year at the date of election.
- 6.3.1 Any Member Club in arrears of subscriptions, or any other due payments shall cease to be Members at the end of that subscription year.

7 Conditions:

- 7.1 A Member Club must notify the EMAMC Secretary in writing, of the name, address, email address, and telephone number of their Club Secretary, Competition Secretary, Treasurer, Chief marshal and EMAMC Delegate(s) on the appropriate EMAMC Club Information form, on the Member Club's own letter headed paper or by email.
- 7.2 A Member club must also inform the EMAMC Secretary in writing (by email or on the Member Club's own letter headed paper) of any alteration to their Club Officials during the year.
- 7.3 Membership may also be terminated if, in the opinion of the EMAMC Executive, a Member Club is found guilty of conduct prejudicial to the EMAMC or its objectives.
- 7.3.1 Termination will not take place before the accused Member Club is given an opportunity to defend the charge against it.

8 EMAMC Silver Jubilee Award:

- 8.1 The EMAMC Silver Jubilee Award will be presented annually to an Individual, Group or Company making the greatest contribution to the development or reputation of Motor Sport within the East Midlands area during a calendar year.
- 8.1.1 Nominations of recipients to be made by Member Clubs.
- 8.1.2 Each Club may make up to two (2) nominations, which should be submitted in writing to the EMAMC Secretary by 30th November of the award year.
- 8.1.3 Nominees need not be members of a Member Club or connected directly with the EMAMC in any way.
- 8.1.4 The winner will be selected from the nominees received by the EMAMC Executive Committee. If a nominee is a member of the Committee at the time of selection, they will take no part in the selection process.

8.1.5 If no nominations are received from any Member Club, then the EMAMC Executive Committee will make its own nomination.

9 ***Rule Changes:***

9.1 This Constitution may only be amended at the EMAMC Annual General Meeting or at an Extra-Ordinary General Meeting after twenty-one (21) days written notice has been given to Member Clubs as to the purpose of the notification.

9.2 The EMAMC can only be dissolved at an Annual General Meeting or at an Extra-Ordinary General Meeting, where twenty-one (21) days written notice has been given to Member Clubs as to the purpose of the notification.

9.2.1 Any funds remaining on dissolution shall be disposed of at the discretion of the paid-up Member Clubs to charitable organisations.

CHAMPIONSHIP EVENT RULES

(For Organisers)

1 General:

- 1.1** The 'East Midlands Association of Motor Clubs Ltd' hereafter referred to as the EMAMC will promote a variety of Championships with the object of increasing interest in these types of events amongst members of Clubs affiliated to the EMAMC.
- 1.2** All clubs affiliated to the EMAMC may submit only Interclub events to be considered for inclusion in any of the Championships.
 - 1.2.1** Championship status will only be granted to an event at the discretion of the relevant Championship Registrar, once the Registrar believes that the event and its organisation meet the EMAMC standards.
 - 1.2.2** New members of the EMAMC should note that they may be required by the relevant Championship Registrar to have their events observed by a representative of the EMAMC before Championship status can be approved.
- 1.3** Organising clubs will pay a levy per event for acceptance in a Championship. Levies should be paid at the beginning of the Championship season. Should the event fail to run the Levy shall be returned in full.
 - 1.3.1** Clubs running dual Championship events will pay one full, and one half levy.
- 1.4** Clubs should submit event dates to the EMAMC Secretary on or before the date specified on the Dates Application Form.
 - 1.4.1** Clubs who have not paid their Annual Subscription prior to the start of the July delegates meeting may not propose their events for inclusion in the EMAMC Championships.
- 1.5** Organising clubs must send a copy of event regulations, final instructions and a full entry list to the appropriate Championship Registrar as soon as they are available. Copies of event regulations or a flyer with sponsor's logos should be sent to all member clubs of the EMAMC.
 - 1.5.1** Organising clubs being observed must send a copy of event regulations, final instructions and a full entry list to the EMAMC Secretary and the relevant Championship Registrar as soon as they are available.
- 1.6** The club will provide proper facilities at signing on for the Championship Registrar together with the proper provision for the EMAMC promotional material and that of the Championship Sponsor.
 - 1.6.1** Promotional material for individual events will appear in Championship Bulletins. It is the responsibility of organisers to provide this material to the respective Championship Registrars. This information will be sent to Championship Contenders and member clubs of the EMAMC at least bi-monthly by the Executive committee.
- 1.7** The event will comply with individual Championship Regulations.
 - 1.7.1** Event Regulations will carry the Championship Title, Championship Permit Number and a full-page advertisement for the Championship Sponsor.
- 1.8** Full results must be sent to the Championship Registrar within seven days of being declared final.

Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the organising club not having a future event considered for a Championship.

- 1.9** When an event within the EMAMC Championship is moved for any reason the Clerk of the Course for that event must contact at the earliest possibility the EMAMC Secretary and the Clerks of the Course of events on either side of the new intended running date of the event prior to submitting the new date. In the event of any dispute the EMAMC Executive Committee's decision will be final.
- 1.9.1** Clubs accepting authorisation of a date for a Championship round other than the notified date without consulting the Association will result in the withdrawal of Championship Status. In the event of any dispute, the EMAMC Executive Committee's decision will be final.
- 1.9.2** In the event of a date change or cancellation after the Championship Regulations have gone to print the organising club may be held responsible for any costs incurred by the Association as a result of this change. If the date change is unavoidable, clubs must comply with 1.9.
- 1.10** Clubs must ensure that the Secretary of the Meeting or another nominated official contacts the Association Secretary and Championship Registrar **before** publication of the regulations for the event to allow time for the distribution of the information to the registered contenders and member clubs of the Association. Event Regulations must state the date and time of the opening of online entries.

2 Individual Championship Rules

2.1 EMAMC Stage Rally Championship.

- 2.1.1** All entry lists must show which competitors are registered contenders.
- 2.1.2** All entry lists must show which vehicles are four wheel drive.
- 2.1.3** Event regulations must include the current EMAMC sponsor's advertisement.

2.2 EMAMC Road Rally Championship.

- 2.2.1** The Championship will consist of events running under an Interclub permit.
- 2.2.2** All entry lists must show which competitors are registered contenders.
- 2.2.3** With effect from 1st January 2012, the EMAMC may appoint one or more DSOs to any of its Road Rally Championship events.
- 2.2.4** The **only** types of **navigation** permitted on Championship events are as follows:-

A. Map References (MRs)

- If MRs are out of order they **MUST** be numbered or lettered.
- If MR "avoids" (black spots) are used they must also be in number or letter order in the on-going direction of the route.
- Roman numerals or other coding of MRs must not be used e.g. A=1, B=2 etc.
- may include KM squares i.e. 4 figure map references

Recommendations – To limit long lists of map references and especially lists of blackspots to just two or three handouts. (OK for pre-plot).

B. Tulip Diagrams

- Must have EITHER a head or a tail (or both). However in circumstances where a wrong decision or guess would send competitors immediately straight into a problem (such as a black spot, a 30 mph limit, private road, against rally traffic etc.) then the tulip should have both a head and tail.
- If out of order, all tulips must be numbered or lettered (again no Roman numerals).
- "Mirror image" tulips must not be used.

C. Herringbones

- May be circular or geometric BUT they MUST have a start point AND direction of travel.
- "Mirror image" herringbones must not be used.
- All herringbones must have start point (i.e. no guessing which end to start).

D. Grid lines

- Either in order or, if out of order, they must be numbered or lettered.
- Must not include instructions "to cross grid line X so many times and Y so many times".

E. Spot Heights (SHs)

- Either in order or, if out of order, they must be numbered or lettered.
- SHs must not comprise a mathematical calculation (e.g. "pass through 8 SHs totalling 798 metres").

F. Photocopies of maps

- Self-explanatory.

G. Map Tracings

- These may be used but MUST be to scale and numbered or lettered. Also all PCs and GWs must be marked on the tracings.

H. Grid Boxes

- These may be used (as diagrams) BUT they MUST be numbered or lettered and the point of both approach and departure must be indicated.

J. Map Features

- These may be used BUT ONLY where they actually appear to touch the road (such as letters, gradient arrows and mileposts). Therefore cannot have something like "pass within 100 metres of a church with a steeple, 200 metres of a Battlefield and 300 metres of a Nature Reserve".

2.2.5 Events **must** conform to the following use of **code boards**: -

- Code boards - in the interests of safety they must not be put on, or just over, brows.
- Code boards must NOT be secretly located i.e. they must either have a specific map reference or be specified between two reasonably close parameters on the map e.g. "PCA is between tulip junctions 3 and 4" or "PCB is in the SW quarter of KM square 1234".
- Code boards must conform to Motorsport UK's ruling, regarding size and maximum number of digits (note - there is no minimum number of digits).
- Code boards situated on not-as-map grass triangles MUST either have a sketch plan in the route instructions or a standing instruction in the pre-event paperwork saying "go the long way round all those junctions specified as GT in the handouts".

Additional recommendations – code boards

- That reflective (part) number plates are used.
- That there is one box per passage/code board on the time cards (no more, no less).
- Penalty for missing a passage, route or secret check to be in minutes, either 5 or 10 minutes, rather than a Fail.

- 2.2.6** If regularity **sections** are used, any calculations required must be sensible and able to be computed "in the head" - thus instructions such as "drive at 23.7 mph to the tenth junction and then at 25.8 mph to the sixth spot height" are NOT allowed!
- 2.2.7** Rejoin points must specify the approach and must be where a handout is collected or located where the route has been previously issued to all competitors. There must be at least six rejoin points in the whole rally (excluding start and finish controls). One may be the rest halt. At least two rejoin points and the half way halt must be given at the start, the remaining three must be given at the rest halt or at some point before. In the case of events running under a **navigational permit** then the event should comply with **R 16.1.5** of the Blue book.
- 2.2.8** Organisers are free to use **white roads** as they deem fit BUT the approximate amount of white mileage must be stated in the event regulations and whether a sump guard is recommended. Be honest!
Recommendation: Organisers to be totally honest in the event regulations regarding 'white' mileage and condition of the surface.
- 2.2.9** Event **regulations** must comply with the following: -
- They **MUST** state that the navigation will conform to the EMAMC standards and (for the benefit of novices) contain examples of the types being used.
 - A copy of the draft regulations for either new events or established events but with a new Clerk of the Course must be sent to the Road Rally Championship Registrar for vetting.
 - They **MUST** include the current EMAMC sponsor's advertisement.
- 2.2.10** Strong consideration should be given to ensure novices get to the end of the first half so that all (or at least most) have sufficient time make-up to be able to leave the half-way on their due minute (even if this means a fairly easy first half for experts).
- 2.2.11** PCs and GWs should be given in the general flow of the navigation and not in small print at the bottom of the page e.g. do NOT say PCs or GWs "will be found at the 17th and 29th junctions".
- 2.2.12** If any 30 or 40 mph zones are used on competitive sections it must be forewarned in the handout or cautioned in the pre-plot.

1. SPORTING REGULATIONS - General

1.1. *Title and Jurisdiction:*

The **CLUBMAN MOTORSPORT EMAMC ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP 2024** is organised and administered by the **East Midlands Association of Motor Clubs (EMAMC)** in accordance with the General Championship Regulations of **Motorsport UK** and these Championship Regulations.

1.2.3. Judicial Procedures will be in accordance with Section C of the 2024 **Motorsport UK Yearbook and the **CLUBMAN MOTORSPORT EMAMC Road Rally Championship 2024** Championship Regulations.**

1.3. *Competitor Eligibility:*

1.3.1. Entrants must be in possession of a valid 2024 **Motorsport UK Entrants Licence.**

1.3.2. Drivers and Navigators must be fully paid up, valid membership card holding members of an **EMAMC registered club, be registered for the **Clubman Motorsport EMAMC Road Rally Championship 2024** and be in possession of a valid Interclub, or higher grade, 2024 **Motorsport UK** Competition Licence.**

1.4. *Registration:*

1.4.1. All competitors who wish to take part in the **2024 Clubman Motorsport EMAMC Road Rally Championship must register on-line at <https://www.emamc.org.uk/downloads/2024-EMAMC-Registration.pdf> in advance of the first round on which they want to score championship points.**

1.4.2. No points can be scored before the Registrar has received a registration form from a competitor.

1.4.3. The cost of Championship registration will be **free for all classes.**

1.5. Championship Rounds:

1.5.1. The Championship will consist of only events running under an Interclub Road Rally Permit or a Navigational Permit where all vehicles comply with J and R18 & R21 (2024 **Motorsport UK** Yearbook).

1.5.2. In the event of a date change or cancellation of any round, the Championship has the option to change the respective date Pursuant to R1.1.11. if a Championship round is cancelled, or changes its date, due to reasons of force majeure the Championship Organisers may arrange for an alternative event, or date for an event, to be included in their Championship calendar. Subject to A2.4, only one such change to a Championship calendar will be permitted during the duration of that particular Championship and the proposed amendment must be subject to Motorsport UK approval and will only be permitted if less than 15% of the competitors registered for the Championship object to the change in writing.

1.5.3 The Six highest scores from the following Seven events will count:

1.5.4 Should any of the Championship Rounds not take place the following format will be applied:-

Seven events run – Six to count

Six events run – Five to count

Five events run – Four to count

Four events run – Three to count

Three events run – Three to count

Less than three events run - Championship declared null & void

1.5.5 It is the competitors' responsibility to obtain event regulations and submit entries for each event. The **EMAMC** cannot be held responsible for any entries refused.

1.5.6 **Peak Trophy:** Within the **Clubman Motorsport EMAMC Road Rally Championship 2024** there will be a “Peak Trophy” for Drivers and Navigators, based on the Targa Rally rounds. For 2024 these being rounds 1,3,4 & 7

The points scoring will be as that of the main Championship. All rounds to count. Anyone marshalling or organising will be able to count the 60 marshalling points as one of their scoring rounds. In the event of a tie, the competing points will take precedence over the marshalling points.

1.6. Classes:

1.6.1. Competitors will compete in three classes as follows:

Class 1	Novices
Class 2	Semi-Experts
Class 3	Experts

1.6.2. A “**Novice**” is defined as any competitor who has not finished higher than 20th on any “National B or interclub” status road rally on three separate occasions.

A “**Semi Expert**” is defined as any competitor who has finished higher than 20th overall but outside the Top 10 on any “National B or interclub” road rally on three separate occasions.

An “**Expert**” is defined as any competitor who has finished in the top 10 on any “National B or interclub” road rally on three separate occasions.

Once a competitor has achieved a higher status, they will be automatically moved up to that class the following season. A competitor retains the status declared on the registration form for the duration of that season.

Note – The above definitions bear no relationship to the individual event definitions for expert, semi-expert and novice classes. (Thus, it is quite possible, for example, for a contender to enter as an expert on a particular event but still be a novice in the Championship, or vice versa).

1.7. Scoring:

1.7.1. Points will be allocated to an individual driver or navigator based on the overall positions against other registered **EMAMC** contenders ONLY, on the following basis:

1.7.2. All non-finishers (except “exclusions” for unsporting behaviour or bringing the sport into disrepute) will receive 6 points (subject to the maximum number of events to count).

1.7.3. Once the MAXIMUM number of scores to count has been accrued, any subsequent higher score gained will replace the lowest remaining score to count. There is no requirement to reach the maximum number of scores to qualify for an award.

1.7.4. Any contender who elects to marshal on or organise a **Clubman Motorsport EMAMC Road Rally Championship 2024** event shall score **60 points** (same points as a win) on one occasion only. A marshalling duty is **not** compulsory, but if not competing, is welcomed in supporting the event/s. These points will count if required as one of your “best” scores for awards. Contenders will be required to provide proof of marshalling, which will need to be accepted by the Registrar before championship positions are declared final. Marshalling points will only be valid once the contender has competed on a round of the Championship as a Driver or a Navigator

1.7.5. Marshalling duties or points cannot be awarded to any competitor who retires on an event and subsequently volunteers to marshal later on that same event.

1.7.6. Points from the Championship Events will then be placed in ascending order to create a Championship table. The Overall Winners shall be the contenders with the highest number of points at the conclusion

of the year's championship.

- 1.7.7. In the event of a tie at the end of the season, the following will be used to determine a clear result:
1. The greatest number of overall wins
 2. The greatest number of second overall
 3. The greatest number of third overall placings etc. until the tie is broken.
 4. If the tie remains unbroken, the contender to have scored the first win in the **Clubman Motorsport EMAMC Road Rally Championship 2024** shall take precedence.
- 1.7.8. Championship points will be published in the **Clubman Motorsport EMAMC Road Rally Championship 2024** Bulletins, which will be issued to all Registered Contenders via email at least five times throughout the year. Championship tables will be displayed on the **EMAMC** website. These interim points will become final 7 days after the publication of each Bulletin. The end of year points will become final 7 days after the publication of the final end of year Bulletin. **The onus is on the competitor to report any errors or omissions.**
- 1.7.9. Club championship points are awarded for the top three driver scores & top three navigator scores combined for each club on each round. Non-finish and marshalling points do not count towards the club championship. The Overall Winners shall be the club with the highest number of points at the conclusion of the year's championship.

1.8. Awards:

- 1.8.1. The awards will be presented at the **EMAMC** Awards Presentation to be held early in 2025 and will be allocated as follows:

- 1st Overall Driver – The National Benzol Statue and an award
- 1st Overall Navigator – The Challenge Cup and an award
- 1st Expert Driver/Navigator – Two awards
- 2nd Expert Driver/Navigator – Two awards (subject to 3 or more registrations in the class)
- 3rd Expert Driver/Navigator – Two awards (subject to 5 or more registrations in the class)
- 1st Semi Expert Driver/Navigator – T R Enterprises Trophies and two awards
- 2nd Semi Expert Driver/Navigator – Two awards (subject to 3 or more registrations in the class)
- 3rd Semi Expert Driver/Navigator – Two awards (subject to 5 or more registrations in the class)
- 1st Novice Driver/Navigator – The C.A.R.S Trophy and two awards
- 2nd Novice Driver/Navigator – Two awards (subject to 3 or more registrations in the class)
- 3rd Novice Driver/Navigator – Two awards (subject to 5 or more registrations in the class)

1st Highest placed club – The Inter Club Challenge Shield

2nd Highest placed club – The Secretary's Shield

The best event – The Whitehorn Starr Trophy

Highest placed Lady Driver or Navigator – George Jenkins Rose Bowl and an award.

Peak Trophy 1st Overall Driver – The Bown Trophy and an award

Peak Trophy 1st Overall Navigator – The Wheeldon Trophy and an award

Peak Trophy 1st Semi Expert Driver – The GB Engineering Services Trophy and an award

Peak Trophy 1st Semi Expert Navigator – The Glyn Byard Trophy and an award

Peak Trophy 1st Novice Driver – The AB Motorsport Trophy and an award

Peak Trophy 1st Novice Navigator – The Burgess Trophy and an award

Note: The Best Event will be decided upon via an email pole to each registered contender after the last round. Highest number of vote wins.

- 1.8.2. No contender may win more than one award other than the Ladies, and Peak Trophy awards.
- 1.8.3. All named trophies remain the property of the **EMAMC**. Competitors are responsible for ensuring that all named trophies are safely returned to the Awards Secretary by the 30th November 2025 and will be held responsible for any loss or damage sustained in transit.

2. TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

2.1. *Eligible Vehicles:*

- 2.1.1. All vehicles must comply with J and R18 (2024 MSUK Yearbook)

2.2. *Safety Requirements:*

- 2.2.1. All competitors are asked to note the General Safety Recommendations K14. (2024 **Motorsport UK** Yearbook).

3.0 MOTORSPORT UK RESPECT CODE

- 3.1** By registering for the Championship all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code.
- 3.2** Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.
- 3.3** It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report to Motorsport UK. 1. SPORTING REGULATIONS – General

The 2024 CLUBMAN MOTORSPORT EMAMC STAGE RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP (hereafter referred to as the Championship) is organised and administered by the East Midlands Association of Motor Clubs Limited (EMAMC) in accordance with the General Championship Regulations of Motorsport UK and these Championship Regulations.

1.2. Officials:

1.2.2. Championship Stewards: David James, Phil Rees and Len Fowkes.

1.3. Competitor Eligibility:

All competitors must be current members of an EMAMC registered club, be registered for the 2024 CLUBMAN MOTORSPORT EMAMC Stage Rally Championship and be in possession of a valid Interclub or higher grade, 2024 Motorsport UK Competition Licence.

1.4. Registration:

- 1.4.1. All competitors who wish to take part in the 2024 CLUBMAN MOTORSPORT EMAMC Stage Rally Championship must submit a championship registration form to the championship registrar prior to being awarded points. This should be submitted via the championship registration page at <https://membermojo.co.uk/emamc> which will issue a receipt once approved. A paper copy can be requested and returned via email if required.
- 1.4.2. Contenders must nominate their EMAMC registered club on the championship registration form. This will be used for calculating the club championship points scoring. The nominated club can be changed by notifying the championship registrar in writing (via email is fine) but points scored in any events prior to the change will remain allocated to the originally nominated club.
- 1.4.3. The Championship is FREE to enter for any member of an EMAMC registered club and will include a pair of 2024 decals. Contenders must ensure they affix the 2024 Championship decals on either side of the car they are using on any championship event to score points on that event. There will be a postage charge of £10 per pair (if required) for replacement decals.

1.5. Championship Rounds:

- 1.5.1. There are 8 events in the 2024 championship (plus a reserve event to be used if required). A competitor's best 5 scores across the 8 events will be counted for the purposes of the overall EMAMC championship scoring.

In addition to the main championship we will run the Asphalt Cup Challenge (marked A in the table above) for the best 3 points scores across the 4 asphalt events.

In the event that some events do not run, the main championship will change to the following basis for scoring.

7 or 8 events run – 5 to score

5 or 6 events run – 4 to score

4 events run – 3 to score

Less than 4 events run – championship cancelled

1.5.2 In the event of a date change or cancellation of any round, the Championship has the option to change the respective date or replace with a different event. Pursuant to R1.11.1 and D11.1, agreement of competitors to any such changes will be obtained via email to the latest notified address with non-responses being taken as assent.

1.5.3. It is the competitor's responsibility to obtain regulations and submit entries for each event. The EMAMC cannot be held responsible for any entries refused.

1.6. Classes:

1.6.1. Competitors will be divided into classes based on the engine size and configuration of the car in which they are competing as follows:

Class 1: Up to 1400cc

Class 2: 1401cc - 1600cc

Class 3: 1601cc - 2000cc

Class 4: 2001cc and above

Class 5: All Four-Wheel drive cars

1.6.2. Turbo cars will be subject to the Motorsport UK capacity equivalent formula (x1.7) Rotary engine cars will be subject to the Motorsport UK capacity equivalent formula (x1.7)

1.7. Scoring:

1.7.1. All contenders will be required to display on each side of the competing vehicles the 2024 EMAMC Championship decals provided by the Championship Promoters on all Championship events to be able to score points. These decals must be kept in a legible condition. Registered co-drivers accompanying non-registered drivers are eligible to score EMAMC points but they must ensure that there are 2024 EMAMC Championship decals affixed on the car.

- 1.7.2. Points will be awarded in the Championship with reference to class positions in the official results of each event and relative to the contender's performance in their class against other EMAMC Stage Rally Championship registered contenders on the event, on the following basis:

1st	2nd	3rd	4th	5th	6th	7th	Finisher	Starter/Non-Finisher
20	17	15	14	13	12	11	10	5

In addition, 1 bonus point will be scored for each EMAMC starter beaten in class up to a maximum of 5 points per event. 5 points will be awarded for starting an event but not being classified as a finisher.

- 1.7.3. The event entry list, starters list, and final results will be used to confirm entry and Championship points will be allocated as appropriate.
- 1.7.4 Any championship contender who registers with Motorsport UK for a 2024 marshal registration or officials licence can be awarded 5 bonus points in the main championship by submitting a photo of their registration/ licence to the championship registrar via email.
- 1.7.5 Any championship contender who acts as a signed-on setup team member, signed-on marshal or event official on a counting round of the championship will be eligible to be awarded 10 bonus points for this role. This bonus can only be claimed once during the 2024 championship and will be verified with the event organisers and/or chief marshal. If this round is part of the Asphalt Cup, they will be awarded 5 points in the Asphalt Cup for this role in addition to the main championship points.
- 1.7.6 There are 8 events in the EMAMC championship. The best 5 scores across the 8 events will be counted for the purposes of EMAMC Championship scoring unless there are less than 8 championship events run. See 1.5.1 for details. In the event of cancellation of a round, the reserve round will become a counting round of the championship.
- 1.7.7 There are 4 events in the Asphalt Cup. The best 3 scores across the 4 events (marked A in list 1.5.1) will be counted for the purposes of Asphalt Cup scoring. In the event of cancellation of a round of the Asphalt Cup, the reserve round will become a counting round of the Asphalt Cup. In the event that only 3 events run then it will be 3 scores from 3 events. If less than 3 events run then we will cancel the Asphalt Cup.
- 1.7.8 In the event of a tie at the end of the season, the following in order, will be used to determine a clear result: 1. The greatest number of 1st in class positions. 2. The greatest number of 2nd in class positions. 3. The greatest number of 3rd in class positions. This will continue down to 8th in class positions. 4. Should the tie still remain then the competitor with the car of lesser engine capacity (Motorsport UK capacity equivalent formula to apply) shall be the winner.
- 1.7.9 Results will be published in the 2024 CLUBMAN MOTORSPORT EMAMC Stage Rally Championship Bulletins, which will be posted and dated on the EMAMC website at www.emamc.org.uk. The onus is on the competitor to report any errors or omissions to the Championship Registrar within 7 days of the dated results. Any subsequent appeals must be made in accordance with Motorsport UK GR C6.5. These results may also be duplicated in other locations such as the Championship Facebook group or www.clubmanmotorsport.com

1.8. Awards:

1.8.5 All named trophies remain the property of the EMAMC and must be signed for personally, at the awards dinner. Competitors are responsible for ensuring that all named trophies are safely returned to the Awards Secretary by the 30th November 2024 and will be held responsible for any loss or damage sustained in transit.

1.8.6 The highest placed Club will be determined using the 4 highest points scored, by either drivers or co-drivers, in each club on each round of the Championship. Maximum score is therefore 4 x 35 points = 140 points per event. The points will be awarded to the club nominated by the competitor as per 1.4.2 of these regulations.

- 1.9.2 Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.
- 1.9.3 It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. 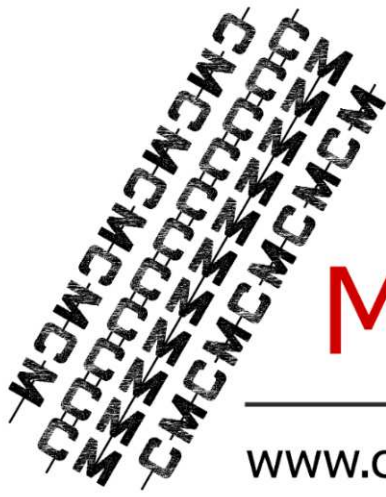

1.2.3. Judicial Procedures will be in accordance with Section C of the 2024 **Motorsport UK** Yearbook and the **The Spectrum and The One Point EMAMC Autosolo Championship 2024** Championship Regulations.

1.3. *Competitor Eligibility:*

1.3.1. Entrants must be in possession of a valid 2024 **Motorsport UK** Entrants Licence.

1.3.2. Drivers must be full members of an **EMAMC** registered club, be registered for **The Spectrum and The One Point EMAMC Autosolo CHAMPIONSHIP 2024** and be in possession of a valid RS Clubman, or higher grade, 2024 **Motorsport UK** Competition Licence.

1.4. *Registration:*

1.4.1. All competitors who wish to take part in **The Spectrum and The One Point EMAMC Autosolo CHAMPIONSHIP 2024** must have completed the championship registration form and returned it to the Championship Registrar by post or email. Photo images are acceptable.

1.4.2. No points can be scored before the Registrar has received a registration form from a competitor.

1.4.3. The cost of Championship registration will be **free** for all classes.

1.5. **Championship Rounds:**

1.5.1. The Championship will consist of only events running under a Clubman Autosolo Permit where all vehicles comply with sections J and M (2024 **Motorsport UK** Yearbook).

1.5.2. In the event of a date change or cancellation of any round, the Championship has the option to change the respective date or replace with a reserve round. Pursuant to D11.1, agreement of competitors to changes will be obtained via email to the latest notified address with non-responses being taken as assent.

1.5.3 The Ten highest scores from the following Eighteen events will count:

 Three events run – Three to count
 Less than three events run - Championship declared null & void

Due to the ongoing Pandemic Dates may change to suit venues and permits being allowed

1.5.5 It is the competitors' responsibility to obtain event regulations and submit entries for each event. The **EMAMC** cannot be held responsible for any entries refused.

1.6. Classes:

1.6.1. CLASSES

The AutoSolo will each consist of six classes as follows:

CLASSES

- A Series Production Saloons up to 1400cc
- B Series Production Saloons over 1400cc up to 1700cc (includes 1000cc Turbo)
- C Series Production Saloon over 1700cc up to 2000cc
- D Series Production saloon cars 2000cc and over plus Sports Cars (including kit cars)
- E Electric Cars

Note as per the "Blue Book" a capacity multiplier of 1.7 to 1 will be used for all forced induction engines.

1.6.2 Where an event is run on sealed surfaces the championship event will be an Autosolo.

1.7. Scoring:

1.7.1. Points will be allocated to a driver on the overall positions and class positions against other registered **EMAMC** contenders ONLY, on the following basis with the total combined:

1.7.2. All non-finishers (except "exclusions" for unsporting behaviour or bringing the sport into disrepute) will receive 1 point (subject to the maximum number of events to count).

1.7.3. Once the MAXIMUM number of scores to count has been accrued, any subsequent higher score gained will replace the lowest remaining score to count. There is no requirement to reach the maximum number of scores to qualify for an award.

1.7.4. Points from the Championship Events will then be placed in ascending order to create a Championship table. The Overall Winners shall be the contenders with the highest number of points at the conclusion of the year's championship.

- 1.7.5. In the event of a tie at the end of the season, the following will be used to determine a clear result:
1. The greatest number of overall wins
 2. The greatest number of second overall
 3. The greatest number of third overall placings etc. until the tie is broken.
 4. If the tie remains unbroken, the contender to have scored the first win in **The Spectrum and**

The One Point EMAMC Autosolo Championship 2024 shall take precedence.

- 1.7.6. Championship points will be published in **The Spectrum and The One Point EMAMC Autosolo CHAMPIONSHIP 2024** Bulletins, which will be issued to all Registered Contenders via email at least five times throughout the year. Championship tables will be displayed on the **EMAMC** website. These interim points will become final 7 days after the publication of each Bulletin. The end of year points will become final 7 days after the publication of the final end of year Bulletin. **The onus is on the competitor to report any errors or omissions.**
- 1.7.7. Club championship points are awarded for the top three driver scores combined for each club on each round. Non-finish points do not count towards the club championship. The Overall Winners shall be the club with the highest number of points at the conclusion of the year's championship.

- Highest placed Lady – A Trophy and an award
- 1st Highest placed club – A Shield
- 2nd Highest placed club – A Shield
- The best event – A Trophy.

- 1.8.2. No contender may win more than one award other than the Ladies or Junior Trophy awards.
- 1.8.3. All named trophies remain the property of the **EMAMC**. Competitors are responsible for ensuring that all named trophies are safely returned to the Awards Secretary by the 30th November 2024 and will be held responsible for any loss or damage sustained in transit.
